The meeting of the Oswego Township was called to order at 6:30 P.M by Supervisor Joe West. The meeting was held at 99 Boulder Hill Pass, Montgomery, Illinois. The pledge of allegiance to the U.S flag was given by all in attendance.

Township officials in attendance were Supervisor West, Trustees Bush, Sawicki and Selmer. Also present were Clerk Holmstrom and Highway Commissioner Ainsworth. Lynn Cullick, Rob DeLong, Jim Zimmerman and Frank Carney were present. Trustee Helgeson arrived at 6:43. Deputy Sheriff was present. The Township attorney was present. Assessor Hauser was excused from this meeting. One resident was present. Supervisor West stated that a quorum was present.

Kendall County Undersheriff Teams Up With Local Law Makers on New Legislation

Undersheriff Bobby Richardson and [State Senator Linda Holmes](#) worked together this spring to expedite the process for job-seeking veterans to qualify for open law enforcement positions. Their work produced Senate Bill 2778, which was signed into law by Gov. JB Pritzker earlier this month. The new law ensures these men and women, who have already demonstrated a dedication to service and a desire to protect our communities, are eligible to request an examination with a sheriff's office within six months of an honorable discharge. This means veterans will not have to wait for the current testing cycle to be completed before they can apply, which can take up to two years.



The Kendall County Sheriff's Office conducted a traffic safety campaign July 9th-31st reminding motorists to slow down to save lives. The speed enforcement effort was conducted by the Kendall County Sheriff's Office and other State and local law enforcement agencies across Illinois to reduce highway fatalities. During the campaign, the Kendall County Sheriff's Office issued:

- 365 speeding citations
- 1 child car seat citation
- 13 suspended/revoked license citations
- 21 uninsured motorist citations and,
- 3 fugitives were apprehended

The speed enforcement effort was made possible by federal traffic safety funds administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation.



We want to warn residents of another round of telephone scams that seem to be going around. We have received several reports recently from people contacted by someone claiming to be Detective Wolf. THIS IS A SCAM! The caller states the victim failed to comply with a federal subpoena and a warrant was issued for their arrest. The caller then texted a screenshot of a fake arrest warrant and demanded the victim pay to avoid arrest.

The **Illinois Department of Revenue (DOR)** for Illinois sets the guidelines for the work we do as assessors. They keep track of the work we do with **SALES RATIOS**. A Sales Ratio is the relationship between the assessed value and market value of a property, derived from the sales data. The result is a percent relationship between assessed value and market value.

- **Sales Ratio**= $\frac{\text{Prior Year's Assessed Value}}{\text{Current Year Selling Price}} \times 100(\%)$

EXAMPLE: 624 SALEM CIRCLE

- Sales Ratio= $\frac{103,713 \text{ (2023 assessment)}}{\$400,000 \text{ (Sale Price 8/6/24)}} \times 100(\%) = 25.92$

The **IDOR** tracks all of our sales to determine how much of an increase in assessed value each county and each township needs to be as close to 33.33 as possible. (We take it a step further and analyze each neighborhood to determine how high or low we are on each one).

Coefficient of Dispersion (COD) is the most commonly used statistical measure of uniformity. It indicates, on average, the percentage the sales ratios are off from the median sale. It can be considered as the average error expressed as a percentage.

In the following chart attached you can see the townships in Illinois (excluding Cook County) that have had a **COD** of less than 15 during the years 2019-2022. There were only 52 townships in the state that finished with a COD of less than 15 all four years (**approximately 1,200 assessors**). Oswego Township ranks 2nd with an average COD of 8.18 with an average of 6th annually on the list. Our office works hard to make sure we are assessing all the residents of Oswego Township fairly and equitably.

Finally, attached you will see the Assessor section of the salary survey provided by Troy Township. You might notice that the Cook County Assessors have been removed from the list as they don't perform the same duties as the rest of the Township Assessors in the state. In Cook County, the assessments are handled at the county level, not by the Township Assessors. 5 columns have been added to show how these other Assessors have done with the COD study. The 5th column shows where each ranked on the prior spreadsheet. Oswego Township has done the best on this list and in many cases by a very wide margin. (3 show n/a since they had year(s) that they weren't under 15 on their COD).

It should also be pointed out that the 2023 EAV for Oswego Township was almost 200,000,000 short of the actual number. Perhaps some of the other numbers in this survey may not be accurate.

ORDINANCE REPORT

August 2024

To date I have investigated over 130 ordinance complaints, (this includes 13 joint investigations with Kendall County) that resulted in 107 violations issued. The violations are as follows: 12 violations for unauthorized trailer/RV parking, 3 inoperable vehicles, 54 junk and debris complaints and 38 tall grass violations, 5 second time violations one is a 3-time violator in an occupied residence. Of the tall grass violations, 5 properties needed to be mowed for non-compliance. I am also currently working 3 joint investigations, one with Kendall County Health Department and 1 with Planning Building and Zoning and 1 with multiple County agencies.

We are still receiving calls for both general and emergency assistance, mainly for rental assistance, and we have 0 cases pending.

The cemetery has been very busy with upkeep, burials and damages. On July 15, Oswego Cemetery took a direct hit from an F1 tornado causing over \$4000 damage. This line of storms generated 32 tornadoes that night in northern Illinois, and the night before storms generated another 9. Luckily the damage at the cemetery was mainly trees and we were able to recoup our cost through TOIRMA.

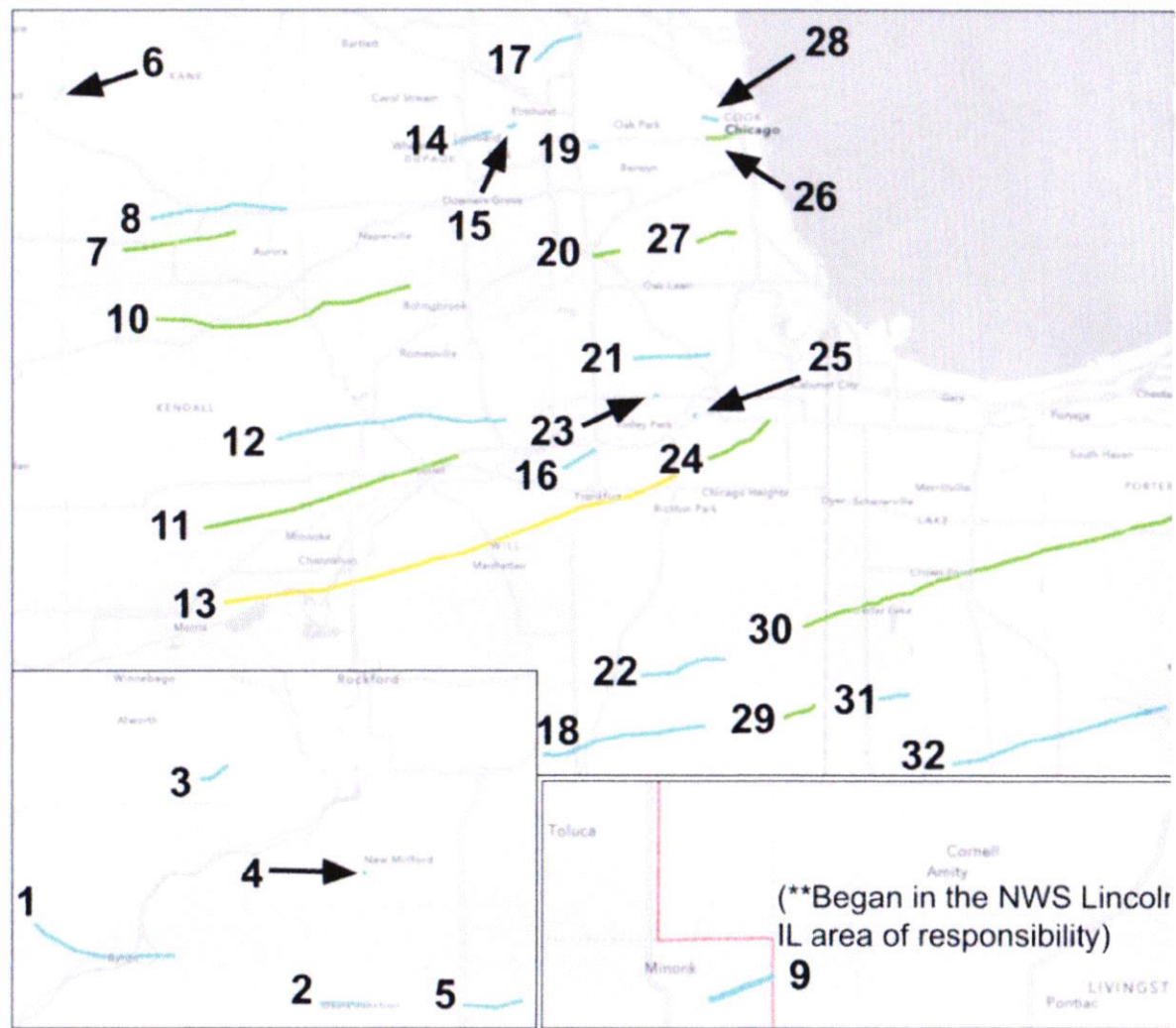
